Hanover was incorporated in 1761. It was named after Hanover Parish of Lisbon, Connecticut. Governor Benning Wentworth selected Hanover as the site of Dartmouth College. Hanover also includes the village of Etna which is named for Sicily's volcanic mountain.

Hanover is a lovely community on the New Hampshire & Vermont border right on the Connecticut River. It is the home of Dartmouth College. The downtown has shopping, restaurants and the well known Hanover Inn.
