Lebanon was incorporated in 1761. It was named by early settlers who were from Lebanon, Connecticut. It was incorporated as a city in 1957.

The word "Lebanon" is the Semitic word for "white" and comes from ancient Lebanon and referred to a mountain with white snows at its summit.

Lebanon is a community just south of Hanover on the New Hampshire & Vermont border right on the Connecticut River. The area of West Lebanon has shopping and restaurants.
